## Incursion Details

- \* Sessions are interactive and involve a variety of games, stories, discussion and multi-media to engage and educate

- \* Single sessions are between 60 and 90 minutes (depending upon year level)
- \* Follow-up lesson plans and resources for teachers are included
- \* Parent sessions are also offered on several topics

## Learning Focus

The **Operation Empathy** incursion encourages students to think about the people they share their home, classroom, school and world with. The incursion focuses on working as a member of a community and how we can best cooperate, communicate, appreciate, support others and thrive as part of a team.

Through a variety of **interactive activities, games, discussion, stories, multi-media**, and **video** the workshop helps students to enact empathy by thinking about putting themselves in someone else's situation and taking positive actions that create a stronger community.

The **Operation Empathy** incursion is recommended for all primary students from lower to upper primary – adapted to suit the age level of the students. In addition to the student incursion, a complimentary teacher resource manual & curriculum is provided that can be implemented & modified to extend the learning outcomes in the classroom over several weeks.

## Key concepts covered in the session:

- What empathy is and how it helps us to interact with others
- Exploring what makes a healthy community
- The importance of teamwork, communication and respect for others
- How student attitudes and actions contribute to creating a culture of belonging and acceptance of others at school
- The importance of the impact of our words and actions on others
- The importance of building trust and how we can achieve this
- Basic conflict-resolution skills
- Problem-solving skills
- The importance of valuing others and how to make a positive difference in helping others
